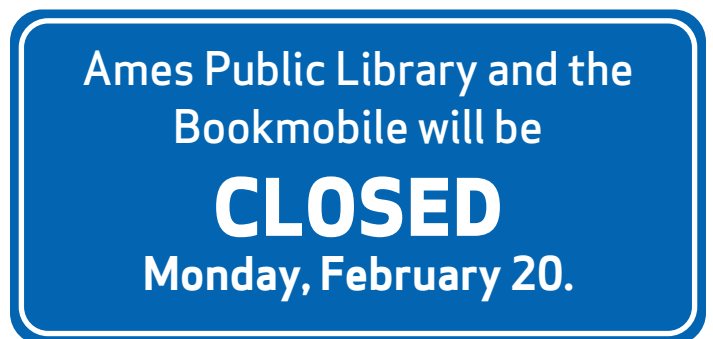


## Sunday, February 19 2pm, Storytime Room
