This program is planned for ages 5 and up, but all ages are welcome. Please pre-register at the Youth Services desk or by calling us at (515) 239-5644.

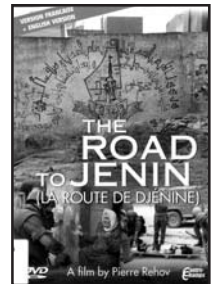
The Road to Jenin

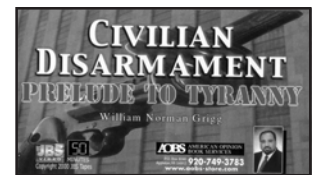

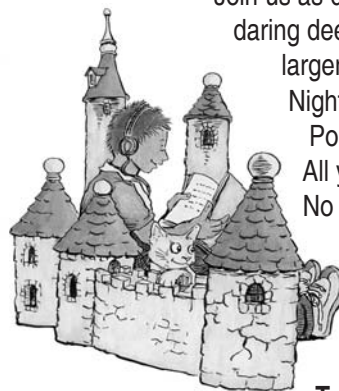

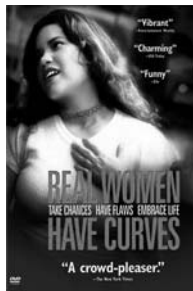
CHICK LIT...
