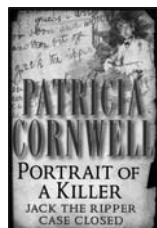

There will be a reception to introduce him to our community on Saturday, August 19 from 2-4pm in the Library's Farwell T. Brown Auditorium. Light refreshments will be served. Everyone is welcome so please stop by and say hello.

In July, the Library began offering computer instruction classes in the computer lab. Staff members taught sessions on basic mouse usage, searching Google effectively, and exploring one of the Library's information databases, *NoveList*. We'll have all those and more in August.

The summer reading programs are ending August 20, but that doesn't mean it's time to stop reading. Now it's time to turn our thoughts to the fall book discussion programs. This fall, the "Let's Talk About It" series will discuss selections on the theme of "True Crime," and the Great Books series will begin a new anthology of classic literature. Our Chick Lit group continues this month with a discussion of *Lydia Cassatt Reading the Morning Paper* by Harriet Scott Chessman. The novel is the poignant story of Lydia, Mary Cassatt's sister, who details the important role she played in the creation of Cassatt's early Impressionist paintings. The September selection will be the classic chick lit novel, *Pride and Prejudice* by Jane Austen. Chick Lit participants are responsible for finding their own copies of the book, but we announce our choices in advance so you can check out the Library's copy, purchase your own, or share with others in the group.

APL's book sharing group, Books @ Noon, has great fun talking about what we're currently reading—the good, the bad, and, sometimes, the ho-hum. Members of this group receive an e-mail following the meeting with a list of all the books discussed. Chick Lit and Books@Noon do not require registration; just come and join us.

The Friends Board will meet near the end of August. First on their agenda is the appointment of a new Board member.

Enjoy the last days of summer, and then it's full speed ahead for fall.


