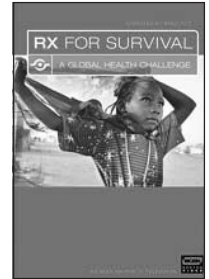
### Global Cinema

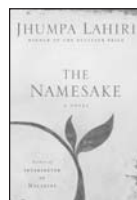
