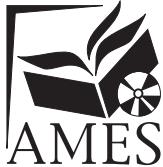

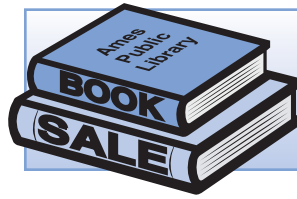

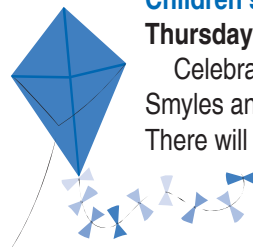


## Month of the Young Child
