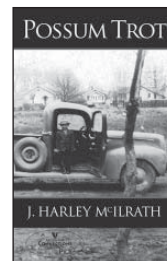

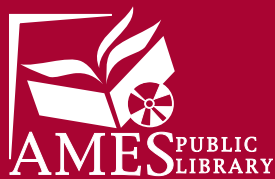

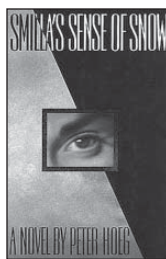
Mystery Lovers Book Club

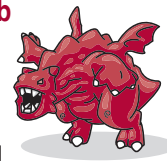
