### Peter Irniq, Inuit Artist

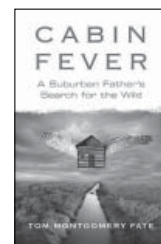

### An Evening with the Author:

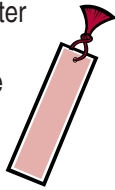
Tom Montgomery Fate

Iowa children's book author Lisa Broadie Cook will read from her new book, *Peanut Butter and Homework Sandwiches*, and talk about the process of publishing.

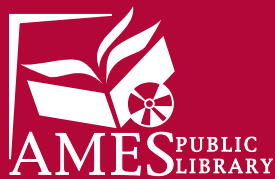


### Civil War Era Schoolyard Games

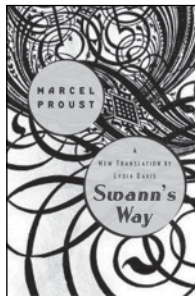
