New Online Catalog

Have you searched the Library for a book, e-book, movie, or CD lately? If so, you may have noticed our new online catalog and account management system.

The new system has some handy features to help you find what you want, save items for later, and more. Here are just a few:

Filter and sort your search.

When you search the catalog, the left side of the page shows options for narrowing your search by author, format, and more. You can also sort your results by popularity, publication date, and many other choices using the dropdown menu at the top of the page.

Get e-mails about new items.

Want to know when we get a new book by your favorite author? Search for the types of items you want, and then click "Save Search" on the left side of the screen. You can choose to receive an e-mail weekly or monthly about new items that fit your search.

Create a list.

Want to start a to-read list? When you find an item, click "Add to My List" on the right side of the page. You can create multiple lists to organize the items you're interested in.
