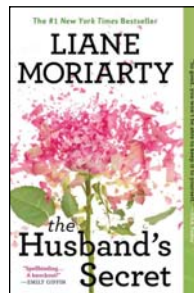

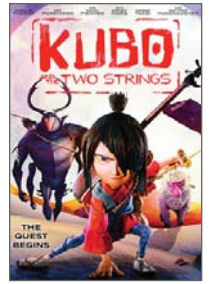

World War II History Talk: B17 Bomber Crash in Story County

Matt Donovan, Iowa DOT Archeologist
and Historian, will share the story of a
WWII plane crash in Story County. In
March 1944, a B17 bomber based in
Kearney, NE, got lost while flying in a
snow and wind storm. It crashed near

crew members. Donovan has researched
aviation archaeology in Iowa and will

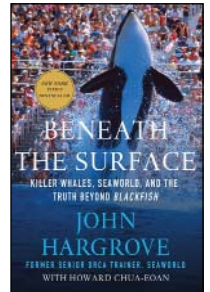

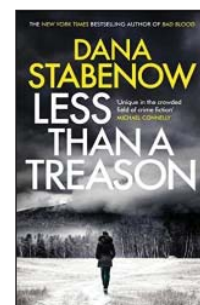
