

1st Thursday of Each Month 10am, Auditorium


Join us for a monthly book discussion just for families that are homeschooling or learning remotely!

This event and books are geared for school-age kids or middle grade reading level, but all ages are welcome to attend.


September 2: What was your favorite summer read?

Understanding Social (In)Justice Through the Power of Place




