

On October 7, we will talk about *Pie in the Sky* by Remy Lai and the humor genre.








and related courses. Dr.

Richard Duncan is filmmaker and a narrator of *The Center Street Story: An Urban Renewal Retrospective*. A former resident of the historic Center Street community, Richard is knowledgeable on both the social and physical aspects of the historic Center Street neighborhood. Richard's Center Street heritage, participation in the historic 1963 March on Washington, and residency in Los Angeles during the 1960s Black Freedom and Civil Rights Movements resulted in a valuable and unique angle of vision of the implications of urban renewal on both local and national scales.



Distinguished Professor of Liberal Arts and Sciences at Iowa State University and Iowa's Poet Laureate






Musical Interpretation and Style
