
THE BRIDGE HOME



Books will be available for purchase.




Wednesday, November 10 10am, PEO Room (Please note change in day and location)

On November 10, we will talk about *A Long Walk to Water* by Linda Sue Park and the historical fiction genre.




Genealogy PLUS

Each monthly Genealogy PLUS event features an hourlong presentation by an expert followed by a study session.






