On behalf of the staff of Ames Public Library, I want to express my appreciation for the outpouring of support this year for the Library Renewal Project. The bond referendum to fund \$18 million of the project was approved by an overwhelming 76% of the voters!

For the past three years, we have been actively engaged in community dialog to determine the future of Ames Public Library and the facility that will serve in the years ahead. Because of the support of the community, this library will continue to be an excellent resource for our growing city of readers, learners, and idea creators. We look forward to a ribbon cutting in late 2014 or early 2015.

In addition to the activity of the Library Renewal Project, the past fiscal year was a busy one for our regular operations. Attendance at library programs increased by 13% with nearly 57,000 people enjoying our events for children, teens, and general audiences. The number of visitors to the library also increased, and our Bookmobile and services for the homebound were busier than ever. Project Smyles remains a popular program for children in daycare and preschool. We are continuing to ramp up our e-book resources to support the demand of new e-reader and tablet owners. 


2010-2011 Highlights


