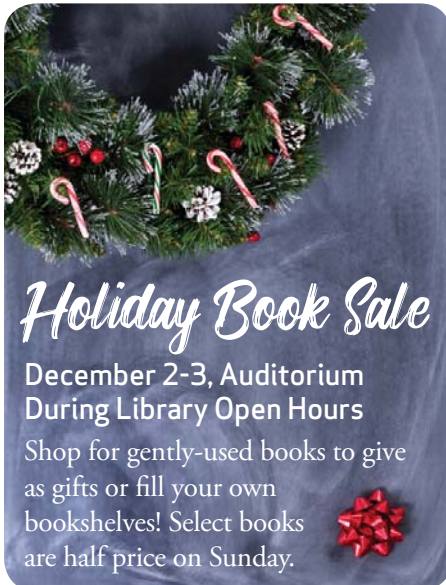
Holiday Concert Featuring Jive for Five!

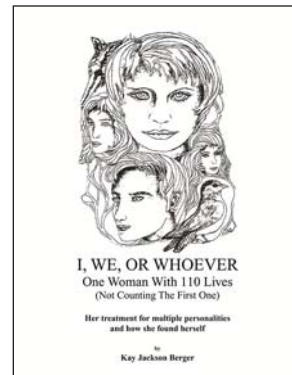
Kay Jackson Berger is a long time resident of the Ames Community who is a Psychiatric Social Worker and first-time author.

Books will be available for purchase and signing.

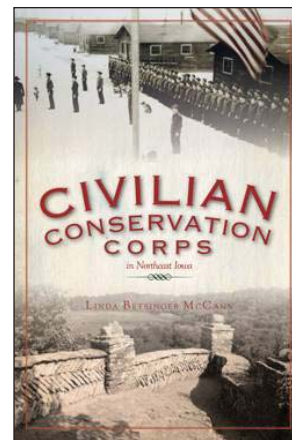

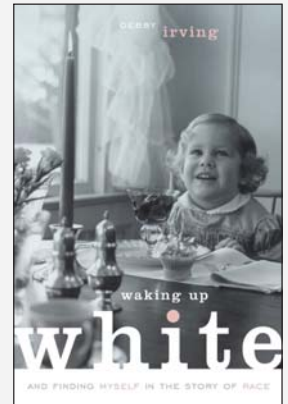
Waking Up White: A Community Book Study
