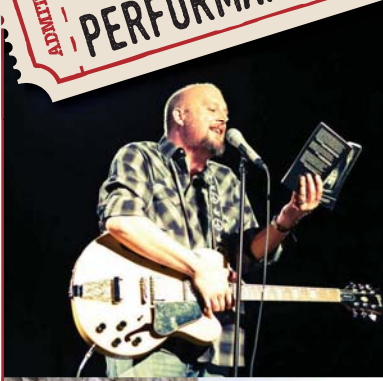
Local musicians will play live music and talk about the artists that inspired them.

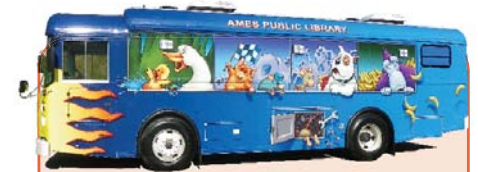
Out of the Fire - The Banned Books Monologues Free Preview

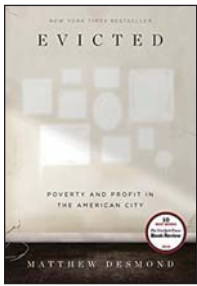

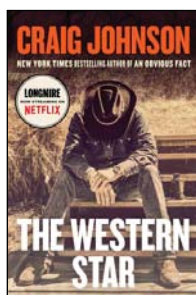
