Over **961,602** items were **checked out last year**. (That's an average of over 2,600 items each day of the year!)





An average of 130 people visited the Library each hour it was open.



Over **3,700 people** signed up for a **library card** in person or online.



The Ames Public Library Friends Foundation conducts fundraising, operates the Literary Grounds bookstore, and holds book sales to support Ames Public Library.

**2,658 children, 584 teens, and 1,729 adults** participated in the 2019 **Summer Reading Program**.

The Library helped combat childhood hunger by serving **2,916 free meals** in summer of 2019 as part of the U.S.

Department of Agriculture's Summer Meals

program **for children and teens**.

Project Smyles offered books and storytimes to children in daycares and preschools through 706 visits and 48 Library tours.

Ames Public Library **borrowed 1,659** items from other Libraries for our patrons and **loaned 4,085** to other Libraries' patrons through **Interlibrary Loan**.

Over 3,750 people signed up for a new Library account.

**32,918 people** attended 748 live and 82 online storytimes and programs for children and families.

**1,349 people** attended 55 live and 9 online Library **events for teens**.

**7,151 people** attended the Library's 421 live and 49 online **programs for adults**.

The Library's **meeting and study rooms** were used for **8,171 times** programs, meetings, tutoring sessions, and more.

Library staff and volunteers made about **600 deliveries** of books to homebound citizens and centers through **Home Delivery**.



# BECAUSE THERE IS NO SINGLE SOURCE OF INFORMATION.

Ames Public Library offers technology and digital resources for many purposes, including bridging the digital divide, helping individuals of all ages gain skills needed in our digital world, and connecting our community with the many resources available online.

**Computers** for the public were used almost **30,000 times** in 2019/2020.

The Library's **iPads** were used **4,400 times** in 2019/2020.

The **early literacy computers** were used over **10,000 times** last year.


Library visitors have free access to the **Internet** via Wi-Fi throughout the building.

Library staff and community partners shared their **technology expertise** through computer classes, iPhone & iPad Training, and more.

Ames Public Library offered cardholders free access to **33 premium online research and learning tools**,

from children's interactive books to popular genealogy software to language learning programs to informational tools and reviews for consumers. In 2019/2020, cardholders searched these online resources an average of over **384 times a day**!



# BECAUSE IN A PANDEMIC GOOD RESOURCES MATTER.







Spring of 2020 was not like any other year, for Ames Public Library or the world. When news of the COVID-19 pandemic reached the United States, Ames Public Library closed its building on March 17 and shifted focus to

providing services and resources online.

Staff worked to get every **Wi-Fi hotspot** to a customer in need, and more were purchased throughout the year.

The Library offered **online card registration**, allowing immediate access to virtual collections. **E-book and streaming video** collections were expanded. The Library added free access to premium **online tools**, including subscriptions to The New York Times, The Wall Street Journal, Cypress Resume, and more.

Library staff became **Facebook Live** experts, **YouTube** stars, and **radio show** regulars, presenting live storytimes, recording reading recommendations, and finding new ways to connect with customers on social media.









Local teens were welcomed into a new virtual hangout on the Library's own **Discord channel**.

While City of Ames buildings remained closed to the public, the Library began offering **curbside pickup** on May 18.

As spring turned to summer, Library staff came up with new ways to offer summer reading fun, including online **Reading Challenges** and **take-home activity kits** for kids. Over the spring and summer, the Library distributed hundreds of **free meals** and gave out over **7,000 free books** for kids and teens (courtesy of the Ames Public Library Friends Foundation).

At the end of 2019-2020 fiscal year, staff were busy gathering huge numbers of requested items (holds) and delivering them curbside while developing a new model of "grab and go" service for the reopening of the Library lobby on July 1.
