

Ames Public Library has shifted to Curbside Service (from grab and go lobby service) in response to increased community spread of COVID-19.


The lobby is now closed and holds are available by curbside pickup instead.

Please wear a face mask covering your mouth and nose during your curbside pickup.

Here's How it Works:

- Place items on hold using the Library catalog, just as you have in the past.
- Wait for notification that your items are ready before coming to the Library.
- Park in front of the Library during open hours. No appointment necessary!
- Text "HERE" to the number on the sign.*
- Follow the automated prompts in the reply.
- Stay in your car and open your trunk or passenger window for staff to place your items in your vehicle.

Film: Moonlight Monday, December 7 7pm, via Zoom Registration Required *


Join us for a film discussion centering on African Americans and their experiences.

Learn about the past, present, and future of Minnesota's Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness (BWCA). This million acre wilderness area is known for its pristine water but is being threatened by the development of sulfide-ore copper mining within its watershed.

Listen to Dr. James Colbert of Iowa State University (ISU) recount stories from his many expeditions into this wilderness, followed by Dr. Dennis Lavrov of ISU describing the BWCA's history as well as the threats facing it today.

This program is developed by the Ames Public Library Teen Advisory Group.




No matter your age, winter is the perfect time to stay inside with a good book. This year, we want to help you nurture a habit of reading. It's as easy as 1-2-3!






