Ames Public Library is joining hundreds of public libraries across the country that **no longer charge overdue fines** for items that are returned late!


This is one step in our commitment to providing equitable access to Library materials and services.

Items that aren't returned are considered lost, and the price of the item will be charged.







Topic: Prohibition in Iowa Presenter: Linda McCann, author & Iowa history researcher

Prohibition was the period of time when it was illegal to manufacture, transport, or sell alcohol in the U.S., including Iowa. Why, then, did Iowa farmers use their corn to make moonshine? McCann will share stories from moonshiners' and bootleggers' children she has interviewed. She will also share newspaper stories specific to the Ames area.



Did you know you can check out a Wi-Fi Hotspot from the Library? Many members of our community lack reliable Internet access, making it difficult to apply for jobs, complete school work, or stay connected.

In the past, Ames Public Library has helped meet this need by offering free Internet, Wi-Fi, and computer access inside the Library. More recently, the Library has expanded access to mobile hotspots, which can be checked out for free and offer unlimited data and connectivity for up to 10 devices.

Thanks to a \$6,000 grant from the Story County Community Foundation to the Ames Public Library Friends Foundation, the Library has added more hotspots to help meet the demand!
