anti-trans legislation during this incredibly dangerous moment in queer history. These portraits feature trans and non-binary youth flanked by their abstracted supportive parents, as well as interviews where subjects speak about the violence and hatred that these laws create, balanced with an incredibly strong message of hope and survival.


Artist Presentation







The latest wave of government run lotteries began in the 1960's in New Hampshire and now all but five states have state-run lotteries, many designated as helping to fund causes such as education. Some argue a mix of factors, including tax aversion, anti-organized crime sentiment, 1970's economic doldrums, and racism, all played a role.

What are the pros and cons of government-run lotteries? Have lotteries fulfilled the dreams of budgetary relief proponents projected? Who is the "average" lottery player? What are the societal consequences of lotteries?
